a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific goal that will be achieved by the funds requested is to design a second floor at the City of Satellite Beach Police Department's existing building to house critical assets and essential personnel to protect them from natural hazards such as hurricanes and flooding. Once constructed, this will allow our Police Department to operate and deliver services to our community during times of flooding and natural disasters without compromising response times and capabilities.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

By designing the second floor addition to our existing Police Department, the City will be able to construct the second floor addition. This second floor addition will allow our Police Department to respond to calls for service during flooding events while protecting our critical assets.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funds requested will directly provide services to citizens by allowing our Police Officers to respond to citizen 911 calls for assistance during flooding while also protecting critical assets.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project are the citizens of Satellite Beach, our neighboring municipalities, Patrick Space Force Base, and unincorporated Brevard County. The estimated population of Brevard County in 2023 was 643,979 according to the US census bureau.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The measure of the outcome of this project would be continuity of operations for dispatch and Police Department response during a flooding event. The method of measuring the outcome of this project is visualizing our Police Departments being able to operate and deliver services to our community during times of flooding and natural disasters without compromising response times and capabilities.
