Making improvements at the Lantana Municipal Beach that include replacing the wooden decking, rafters & railing along the beach boardwalk, & entrance & knee walls; installing an ADA ramp to the beach; recoating the seawall, demolition of the old pavilion structure & design of a new facility, & improvements to the Marine Safety Building & Dorothy Rissler Ln.

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Many of the improvements referenced above were outlined in the Town's 2023 Master Plan, underscoring our long-term vision. The park's amenities, while heavily utilized, are showing signs of wear & tear, impacting user experience &

potentially posing safety risks. These improvements will create a significantly more enjoyable, relaxing, safer, & functional recreational environment for all.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project? A significantly more enjoyable, relaxing, safer, and functional recreational environment and experience for all who utilize this valuable community asset. d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served? Residents, visitors and business owners totaling approximately 13,000. e. Greater usability of a significantly more enjoyable, relaxing, safer and functional recreational environment and experience for all who utilize this valuable community asset. There will be a visible reduction in frustration and maintenance costs as these much-needed improvements will allow residents and visitors alike to better utilize these amenities to their full potential. f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract? Without state funding, these much-needed park improvements could be put off for years, preventing residents from fully enjoying this popular spot & making it harder to keep up with our community's growing recreational needs. The park's current condition limits what people can do there. For example, the aging beach deck is a safety issue and blocks access. The aging infrastructure, especially the beach deck, is a safety hazard. Putting off repairs makes accidents more likely, which could mean injuries and lawsuits against the Town. This is a big concern since the park gets so many visitors. Delaying repairs will just make them more expensive down the road. Fixing things now saves money for the Town and taxpayers in the long run. Constant emergency repairs will put a strain on the Town's budget, taking money away from other important projects. The Town wants to improve its look & encourages property owners to do the same. Delaying the park's improvements will hurt these efforts. 14.
