13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The YMCA is replacing it's 40 yr old aged community center with a new state-of-the-art 55,000 sf community center, with a total estimated cost of \$29,500,000. This will triple the size, serve four times the number of members/citizens (approx 18,000), and be located along one of the busiest thoroughfares in Palm Beach County. The YMCA has partnered with Palm Beach County to secure a 50-year ground lease for the project. Space dedicated entirely to mentoring will attract thousands of vulnerable teens. The current request is for building construction and includes price escalations, parking lot, and access road.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

A full service YMCA will be constructed, at an approximate cost of \$29,500,000 to provide traditional health and wellness programs for all ages, in addition to innovative programming for young people (12-22) in need of mentoring through the Youth engagement and Resource Center. Services will include, assigned mentors, job skills training and placement, postsecondary education placement and tuition assistance services.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Diabetes Prevention programs, swim lessons, youth sports, Teen Leadership programs, summer day camp, preschool, before and after school programming, mentoring, senior wellness programs, community volunteer initiatives, programs that work to prevent childhood drowning, post-secondary education placement, job skills training and placement, group exercise classes, water aerobics, health education classes, CPR and lifeguard training, job fairs, mental health counseling, community meetings, health and nutrition classes, YMCA Youth in Government Program.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elderly persons * Persons with poor mental health * Persons with poor physical health * Jobless persons * Economically disadvantaged persons * At-risk youth * Homeless * Developmentally disabled * Physically disabled * Drug users (in health services) * Preschool students * Grade school students * High school students * University/College students * Teens in need of mentoring services. The individuals to be served on an annual basis will be in excess of 20,000.

Our goal is to have 9 out of 10 teens that come into our Youth Engagement and Resource Center gather the financial assistance/aid necessary and the mentoring/counseling necessary to successfully transition into post-secondary education.
