The project is aimed at upgrading and improving the existing drainage infrastructure in the Historic area of the City; to alleviate flooding, improve runoff storage capacity, eliminate ponding and protect residential property, and is in support of the City's goal of enhancing the level of service for residents within the service area.

Project activities will involve the installation of drainage pipes, structures, and exfiltration trenches, and swale reconstruction along residential roadways.

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Citizens will be provided with new and significantly improved drainage systems that will mitigate ponding and localized flooding on the residential roadways within their communities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project area encompasses approximately 423 acres primarily of residential properties and will serve over 10,000 residents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Project will improve public safety by reducing areas of localized flooding and will improve the percolation and treatment of storm water, thus improving water quality. Outcome will be measured by the number of residents who will no longer be reporting ponding or flooding on or adjacent to their properties.
