Therefore, during storms fire personnel must evacuate the current station. **13. Program Performance**

**a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?**

Funds will be used for design, engineering, site-work, and construction of a new fire station for the Town, which will replace the Town's only fire station - a modular trailer. Currently, during storms the Town's fire personnel must evacuate the modular trailer station and relocate to an adjacent city's fire station, which is 3.5 miles away and does not have the capacity to accommodate the Town's five firefighters on shift. This project will result in shorter response times, greatly expanding and improving the fire and EMS service to the community.

**b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?**



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Southwest Ranches has no hardened facilities to provide emergency fire and EMS services that are rated to withstand the impact and effects of a major hurricane or flooding. The fire station will enhance safety of all citizens and visitors of Southwest Ranches. The station will provide immediate access to emergency services for the population across the thirteen square miles and benefit our mutual aid partners.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

The services provided will include fire and medical services in the form of emergency response. Additional services provided will include fire prevention education, community risk reduction, emergency management, and training opportunities for firefighters to better serve the citizens.

This project will benefit all Town of Southwest Ranches residents, visitors and businesses. It will also benefit motorists traveling along US 27 and Interstate 75 who need emergency services. This department provides mutual aid to the surrounding communities as well.

The benefit will be faster response to fires, disasters, and citizens in need of life-saving medical treatment. This will be measured by improved response times to the area. Emergency response times are recorded and will be used as part of the methodology to measure success.
