### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Webber International University seeks funding to address the critical need for healthcare professionals in Southeast Polk County by expanding its Nursing and Health Sciences Program. The funds will support program growth through enhanced infrastructure, additional faculty, essential equipment, and tuition assistance for underserved students pursuing health science certificates. This initiative aims to increase accessibility, enrollment, and workforce readiness in the region.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funded activities and services will support Webber's health science programs, addressing the local need for qualified registered nurses and medical assistants. By equipping nursing labs, providing educational tools, and offering tuition assistance to underserved students, the program increases access to healthcare education for Southeast Polk County residents facing limited opportunities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funding will provide citizens access to quality health science education, including nursing and health science certificates. With approval to admit 36 nursing students per cohort, Webber will produce 72 graduates annually, addressing local healthcare workforce shortages and offering underserved individuals opportunities through enhanced resources and tuition assistance.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this project is college and university students, specifically aiming to serve between 101 and 200 individuals. This group includes students seeking opportunities for educational advancement, professional development, or other forms of support offered through the project. The initiative is tailored to meet their academic, career, and personal growth needs effectively.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project aims to create a high-quality instructional and learning environment to prepare students for industry exams and enhance their employment prospects, particularly in the healthcare sector. By increasing faculty and staff and offering robust post-secondary education, it addresses the critical demand for healthcare professionals in Southeast Polk County and surrounding areas. The nursing program is designed to graduate 72 workforce-ready individuals annually, equipping them with the skills and certifications needed to enter the healthcare industry. This initiative not only supports economic self-sufficiency for graduates but also helps mitigate the nursing shortage in Florida, aligning with the region's healthcare industry growth and the establishment of new facilities.

The success of the project will be measured through three key indicators; graduation and program completion rates, licensure and certification exam pass rates, and employment rate of graduates.
