## a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Known as the Commissioner's Academic Challenge, state funding of the state academic tournament grant provides a statewide, curricular-based academic tournament for high-achieving students in grades 9 to 12. Funding provided is used to set up and operate the tournament, defray registration and travel costs for student participants, and provide high-achieving students with the recognition they deserve.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



Training & materials provided to educators who then provide student with rigorous, academically-focused extra-curricular activities. Training for teachers with subject area expertise to write & review tournament questions directly related to state curricular benchmarks. Production of electronic displays, graphic displays, & audio components to aid in presentation of questions during competition.

## c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Offset costs for student travel and participation. Local teams use material developed to prepare and conduct local and regional competitions prior to the statewide final tournament.

## d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Over 200 high performing high schools from about 45 of Florida's school districts, as well as charter and private school students.

## e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

## be measured?

To provide rigorous academic high school competition to our most accomplished students. 1. The tournament will recruit 45% of Florida's school districts to participate and include charter and private schools. Outcomes will be measures by providing team participation logs, listings on event website, participation by FDOE.
