a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Amidst rising antisemitism and threats of violence, many students feel unsafe participating in any activity that expresses their Jewish identity. FL has invested significantly to bolster security at Jewish schools and community centers but college campuses remain vulnerable. This initiative will support USF Hillel in launching a data-driven approach to reinforce physical and cultural safety, dispel misinformation regarding Israel and American Jews, and foster relationships on and near campus.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Educational and cultural programming, including workshops to counter misinformation and antisemitic rhetoric, cultural programming to highlight Jewish heritage, values, and traditions, fostering understanding across diverse student and community populations. Wider community outreach to include interfaith events, to build stronger ties and understanding between Jewish and non-Jewish residents.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Access to community events, trainings, and workshops in a secure, data-monitored context. Pre- and post-program data collection, including surveys, will gauge improvement within the USF campus and compare against data from other campuses without such a program.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

University/College students; University/College faculty and staff; Victims of crime; General public

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increased physical safety of students, staff, and community members; Significantly expanded and visible cultural programming, celebrations, and interfaith exposure; Increased access by USF faculty to curriculum regarding antisemitism and the dispelling of misinformation; Improved community outreach and counter misinformation both on campus in in broader community, with greater understanding diminishing threats of violence. Measurement: formal program monitoring and evaluation including pre- and post- data at USF and as a comparison between USF and other campuses without this intervention including utilization, perceived safety, enrollment, and incident tracking
