13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To promote family success by teaching parents positive strategies to raise responsible and emotionally healthy children, with the delivery of parenting workshops and support groups in 3 languages in collaboration with schools, churches, and community centers, radio and television shows, social media outreach, using the AKOR parenting education program, a culturally relevant tool based on universal theory, and years of action research in the multicultural context of Miami-Dade schools.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

-Development of instructional materials in English, Spanish, and Haitian-Creole

-Building of an online collaboration platform

-Implementation of train-the-trainers, parenting workshops, and support groups, in schools, churches, and community centers

-Evaluation of the impact of the AKOR Parenting workshops

-Diffusion of program content via radio, television, and a social media platform

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

-Train-the-trainers will equip educators and community leaders with the skills and knowledge they need to deliver parenting workshops.

-Workshops will empower parent-participants to raise responsible and emotionally healthy children.

-Support groups will help them continue to explore the concepts learned.

-Radio, TV shows, and social media platform will engage those who are hard-to-reach.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project will engage 200 to 400 parents in District 107 and neighboring communities in direct interventions consisting of a 10-hour workshop series and support groups. A larger number of parents will be reached through radio, television, social media publications, and the distribution of parenting materials in print format. Families and the community at large will be impacted as a result.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

-Parents will develop positive strategies to raise responsible and emotionally healthy children, which will help prevent child abuse, improve children's behavior and academic performance, and protect them against drugs, criminal activity, and gang involvement.

-Learning acquisitions of parents will be measured with the 'Parenting Ideas and Practices Questionnaire' at the beginning and at the end of the interventions. Secondary benefits will be measured with self-reports.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties

for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

-Withholding or reducing payments for under-performance or missed deadlines -Mandating AKOR Parenting to redo or repair substandard work at their own expense.
