13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of Project TALKS- Talk, Act, Listen, Know, Support- is to create a "Talkable Community" in Northeast Florida leveraging the power of 5 Behavioral Health agencies across 6 counties. Our project creates a trauma informed community that will encourage healthy conversations, activities, and interventions leader to a focus on mental health and well-being. It will enhance co-responder teams partnering with local law enforcement to reduce incarceration and connect offenders with community-based mental health services, emergency department diversion and supports for families and friends who have lost a loved one to suicide. With the enhancement of the care coordination and co-response teams includes face-to-face follow-ups to increase access to and engagement in supportive services for those in the community.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

- 1. Create talkable communities throughout Northeast Florida to increase the number of individuals with the ability to respond to mental health crisis.
- 2. Expand care coordination activities at Baptist Nassau Crossing to connect with those experiencing mental health crisis through connection to necessary direct services, connection to community resources, and providing face-to-face follow-up until the person in stable.
- 3. Expand our partnership with local law enforcement to integrate mental health professionals within their response teams and provide trauma support to their first responders.
- 4. Provide comprehensive behavioral health services and trauma support to family and friends who have lost someone due to suicide and/or overdose.
- 5. Provide face-to-face follow-up services within 72 hours of emergency department visit or interaction with law enforcement through peer support to increase access to services.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

- 1. Training in Mental Health First Aid and QPR throughout 6 counties in Northeast Florida.
- 2. Care Coordinators expanding to the Baptist Nassau Crossing location on-site will allow for the individuals needs to be met during a mental health crisis, baker act and/or overdose. This allows the Care Coordinator to assess the individuals needs, develop a care plan, provide direct services, connect to community resources, and provide face-to-face follow-up until the person is stable.
- 3. The new Co-Responder team will partner with law enforcement to intervene and provide direct intervention to those identified as having a mental health crisis following a 911 or 988 call as well as face-to-face follow-ups with the individuals 72 hours after the call.
- 4. Continue providing Crisis Counselors who are trained in trauma informed care to provide individual and group support to families and first responders after a death by suicide.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this project includes individuals with mental illness, individuals and families experiencing a mental health crisis, individuals who commit crimes with an identified mental health concern, families and friends who have suffered loss due to suicide/overdose, community members in need of training for youth and adults on the awareness of mental health. Training will be tracked through measuring the number of community members who received the training and the number of trainers available to provide the training.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

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The integration of MH professionals with LEO will reduce incidences related to arrests and trauma. This project will look at those who are baker acted and the number of mental health interventions that led to reduction in arrests. Care Coordination has been shown to increase individuals engagement with comprehensive behavioral health services through follow up care. Care coordinators who complete follow-ups will focus on individuals needs, improved access to care in the community, and a decrease in the costs associated with high utilization of emergency departments. This project will measure the % of individuals enrolled in care coordination, % of individuals who engage in care coordination, and % of individuals who refuse care coordination. This project will also measure the recidivism rate of individuals in the emergency department by looking at the % of individuals who have a readmission to the emergency department within 30 days.
