13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of the YMCA Reads program is to reduce the number of students not reading at grade level. The YMCA Reads program successfully closes the achievement gap in students' reading performance with structured curricula delivered by well-trained teachers and mentors. The YMCA Reads program teaches literacy skills to students via small group tutoring/mentoring. Mentoring enhances academic achievement through relationship building and increased academic self-esteem from learning to read.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Individualized and small group lessons and interactive instruction based on Systematic Instruction in Phonologic Awareness, Phonics and Sight Words, as well as differentiated instruction in reading comprehension and vocabulary acquisition.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct evidence-based reading instruction to struggling readers in grades K-4 with input from classroom teachers and reading coaches.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The YMCA Reads program serves K-4 students who are reading below grade level, with a focus on those from low-income and under-resourced communities. The program is expected to serve approximately 1,000 students across multiple YMCA sites in Florida.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected benefits and outcomes are the improvement of literacy skills among K-4 students reading below grade level, with a focus on increasing reading fluency, comprehension, and overall academic confidence by providing structured tutoring and mentorship. The program's impact will be measured using a combination of pre- and post-program reading assessments. Additional evaluation methods include teacher feedback, student progress reports, and attendance tracking to assess engagement and consistency in participation.
