13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose of this project is to ensure our wastewater system remains operational during power outages thereby preventing any environmental and health related impacts to the community.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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These funds will provide uninterrupted wastewater services to residents during weather events where power is lost. The City will perform preventative maintenance to ensure equipment is continuously operational in order to mitigate sanitary sewer overflows and environmental contamination.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Preventing sewage overflow due to power outages that inhibit property damage, flooding, environmental contamination and health related risks to the community is the primary service provided to citizens.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The targeted population is the entire Pinellas Park community in which these lift stations serve. Pinellas Park has approximately 55,000 residents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit and outcome is to prevent a community-wide health risk. The outcome will be measured through the number of power outage events in which the generators function properly and prevent flooding, foul odors, potential health risks due to sewage overflows, reduced property damage, environmental contamination, high recovery costs and regulatory violations.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Agencies that contract with the City are required to purchase surety bonds at 100% of the cost of the project. Payments may be held pending satisfactory achievement of performance measures or deliverables. Contractors are also required to purchase spill insurance in case of a sanitary sewer overflow event.
