4. Project/Program Description

Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs (GAMSD) is dedicated to ending veteran suicide and restoring dignity and independence to disabled veterans, first responders, and others with disabilities. To meet the growing demand for our life-changing services, GAMSD seeks \$1,250,000 in funding for Fiscal Year 2025-2026. This includes \$250,000 for operational support and \$1,000,000 for campus construction to enhance our capacity to train service dogs. Through custom training programs, our service dogs address critical challenges associated with PTSD, traumatic brain injury, military sexual trauma, mobility disorders, hearing impairments, seizure disorders, and diabetic conditions. This funding will enable us to expand our programs, ensuring that more veterans receive these essential services, while also meeting federal requirements for program continuation under the Wounded Warrior Service Dog Program.

13. Program Performance



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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

GAMSD is committed to ending veteran suicide and returning veterans to a life of dignity and independence. This funding will be used for operating support and construction of essential campus facilities necessary to increase our services to veterans. These upgrades will not only improve service efficiency but also align with federal standards for ongoing funding under the Wounded Warrior Service Dog Program.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

\$250,000 will be used together with \$500,000 of federal funds to increase the number of service dogs we can provide to veterans and add mental health components to our program. \$1,000,000 will be used to construct indoor housing for the dogs. Indoor housing will have a profound improvement on our efficiency and will satisfy federal requirements for continued program funding under the Wounded Warrior Service Dog program.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

GAMSD will train and pair medical service dogs with disabled veterans, to perform tasks veterans are no longer able to do themselves. GAMSD will also provide peer-to-peer support, suicide and crisis intervention, mental health and life coaching, family/caregiver and other lifelong support for the veteran/service dog pair. GAMSD services are provided free of charge and are focused on the unique needs of each veteran. This project will create jobs during construction and provide long-term employment opportunities in training and facility management. It will also generate indirect economic benefits through partnerships with local businesses and vendors.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Disabled Veterans of all military branches and eras along with their families and caregivers. Our services focus on veterans with PTSD, Military Sexual Trauma, Traumatic Brain Injury, and on training dogs to alert for seizures, diabetes, and hearing. Most veterans have a combination of these permanent disabilities. We expect to serve over 600 individuals annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected Benefits: Reduction in PTSD symptoms, suicidal ideation, and nightmares. Improved mental health, social engagement, and family relationships. Enhanced independence and quality of life for veterans. Measurement of Success: Baseline assessments upon application compared to quarterly evaluations after service dog pairings to track improvements in symptoms and mental health, social involvement, and quality of life.
