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We have federal grant funding for one of the Special Needs programs, HIRE-Ability (vocational training program for adults with developmental disabilities); however, that funding ends in January of 2027. We have some smaller grants for the GAP program, our Adult Day Program; however, that grant funding changes each year. Examples include a \$25K grant from UKG this past year, 24-25, and \$50K grant from the Batchelor Foundation back in 23-24. We also have individual donors and fundraising events.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The requested funds will directly support the expansion of DPJCC's Special Needs Services, enhancing programming for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) from early childhood through adulthood. This expansion will allow GAP to add a third classroom, accommodating more adults with IDD in a structured day program. HIRE-Ability will gain additional job coaches to better support vocational training. Transitions will offer increased one-on-one support and speech therapy for preschoolers with developmental delays. GibConnect will provide after-school enrichment with transportation from local schools. These improvements will ensure greater access, individualized support, and meaningful opportunities for lifelong development.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The appropriation will fund direct services for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) across all life stages. GAP will provide a full-day program for adults, offering life skills, enrichment, and employment opportunities. HIRE-Ability will expand vocational training and job placement support. Transitions will enhance early intervention for preschoolers with developmental delays, including specialized instruction, one-on-one support, and speech therapy. GibConnect will offer after-school enrichment, including sports, arts, and academic support, with transportation from local schools. These services will ensure individuals with IDD receive essential support, fostering independence, skill development, and meaningful community engagement.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The requested funding will expand critical services for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) across all ages. The GAP program will add a third classroom, allowing 10 more adults to receive life skills training and enrichment. HIRE-Ability will increase job coaches and acquire a vehicle to transport participants to Food Truck community job sites. Transitions will enhance early intervention by adding one-on-one "shadows" and speech therapy for preschoolers with developmental delays. GibConnect will launch an after-school program with transportation from schools, providing enrichment and social opportunities. These services will promote independence, inclusion, and lifelong development.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes children and adults (ages three years to adults) with intellectual, developmental, and physical disabilities, as well as individuals facing economic and employment challenges. This includes preschoolers needing early intervention, school-age children requiring after-school enrichment, and adults seeking vocational training and day programs. The expansion will serve an additional 10 adults in the GAP program, more job seekers through HIRE-Ability, and increased preschoolers in Transitions with added support services. GibConnect will provide after-school enrichment with transportation. Overall, the project aims to impact hundreds of individuals and families (up to 400 per year), ensuring greater access to essential services.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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The expected benefits of this project include improved mobility, health, mental well-being, cultural enrichment, educational outcomes, and economic activity for individuals with intellectual, developmental, and physical disabilities. GAP will enhance life skills and independence for adults, HIRE-Ability will increase job placements, Transitions will improve early intervention outcomes, and GibConnect will enhance after-school enrichment. Outcomes will be measured through standardized assessments, participation metrics, health indicators, vocational tracking, and pre/post evaluations. Job placement, retention, and skill mastery will be tracked for HIRE-Ability, while engagement, educational progress, and independence will be assessed across all programs to ensure measurable success.
