The funds will be used to transform Las Olas Boulevard into a complete street that enhances pedestrian safety, upgrades outdated facilities, improves ADA accommodations, and creates a vibrant, accessible streetscape that supports the City's Vision Zero Plan.

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The project will include pedestrian safety enhancements, streetscape improvements, facility upgrades, landscaping, and urban design elements to reduce multi-modal conflicts and create a live, work, and play-friendly environment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide safer pedestrian pathways, ADA-compliant facilities, reduced transportation conflicts, and an improved urban environment that promotes walking, biking, and public transit use.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project serves residents, visitors, businesses, and commuters in downtown Fort Lauderdale and along Las Olas Boulevard, as well as regional stakeholders relying on the corridor for transportation and economic activity. The project is expected to directly benefit the 65,000+ individuals employed in downtown Fort Lauderdale, residents, tourists, and commuters who utilize Las Olas Boulevard.

The project will improve pedestrian and traffic safety, support economic growth, enhance urban aesthetics, and solidify Las Olas Boulevard's role as a world-class cultural, commercial, and tourism hub. The success of the project will be measured by tracking reductions in traffic accidents and pedestrian injuries, increased foot traffic and business activity, community satisfaction surveys, and enhanced accessibility as reported by ADA compliance assessments.
