### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Faith and Character based curriculum and life skills training will be taught to over 4000 incarcerated men and women, preparing them to live responsibly with others. Creating a safer prison environment for security staff and the incarcerated, while promoting public safety. The support of a reentry facility that will provide housing for those released from the Department of Corrections custody.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Dorms are transformed into communities that learn how to behave in socially acceptable ways, reducing inmate idleness, improving behavior and promoting public safety. Providing housing and employment for returning citizens out of incarceration, to include those paroled from life sentences.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Programs offered through Horizon Communities are Quest, REEFS, and Computer Labs. Also, Conscious Discipline, victim impact, and restorative justice principles have shown the outcome of restoring self-esteem, responsibility and productivity to inmates while they are incarcerated and once they are released. This serves not only the inmate but also the citizens in the community to which they enter.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Men and Women who are incarcerated in Florida Department of Corrections. More than 3,000 Men and Women will be served this fiscal year through this project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Current and formerly incarcerated persons will benefit from the project and the outcome will be safer communities for the rest of our society. Our disciplinary rates as well as recidivism rates are measured by the Florida Department of Corrections.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Provide program coordinators for supervision of Quest classes, REEFS classes, and operation of the FCB Residential Program computer lab. Measure: Provide monthly time-sheets for hours worked and the monthly activity report. Consequence: If the Contractor fails to meet this Performance Measure, financial consequences of \$15 per hour. Provide a minimum of 18 Quest classes, 18 REEFS, and 18 Computer Lab classes during each FY. Financial consequences of \$200 per class under the required amount.
