The Responsible Fatherhood program aims to enhance fathers' participation in their children's lives through workshops, mentorship, and support groups. The aims to decrease delinquency and lower the risk of children entering the criminal justice system & enhance education. Research has shown that children from single-parent households are more likely to be involved in the criminal justice system, as per "Fragile Families and Child Wellbeing Study" (FFCWS) by Princeton and Columbia University.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The specific activities and services to be provided with these funds include developing and implementing educational/vocational programs, Father 2 Father mentorship program, Trauma Informed Therapeutic Services, Home Environment Stabilization, Improved Student Grades, Behavior & Attendance & Increased Father / Child engagement.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The following are itemized direct services that will be provided utilizing state funding, Parenting Education, Co-Parenting Support, Financial Management, Employment Assistance, Health & Wellness, Social & Emotional Support services, to provide fathers with the support needed to be successful.

The targeted population is single parent families, young fathers, single parent fathers, nuclear families, economically disadvantage families & fathers, at-risk youth and young adults, preschool students, grade school students, high school students, military veterans and divorcees. The total # of individuals to be served is approximately 175.
