The requested funds will improve traffic flow, enhance safety, and reduce congestion at the Chase Road and Main Street intersection. Upgrades include roadway widening, improved signage, lighting, pavement markings, and pedestrian crossings. Drainage enhancements will support stormwater management. These improvements will create a safer, more efficient intersection for motorists, cyclists, and pedestrians, ensuring better accessibility and long-term infrastructure reliability in Windermere.

The project will include installation of a roundabout, roadway widening, installation of upgraded signage, improved pavement markings, and enhanced lighting to improve visibility. Pedestrian crossings will be added to ensure accessibility. Drainage improvements will be implemented to manage stormwater effectively. Engineering, design, and construction services will oversee the project's implementation, ensuring the intersection's safety, efficiency, and accessibility for all users, including motorists, pedestrians, and cyclists.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide improved traffic flow, reduced congestion, and enhanced safety at the Chase Road and Main Street intersection. Upgrades will include better signage, lighting, and pedestrian crossings. Drainage improvements will reduce flooding risks. These enhancements will ensure safer and more efficient travel for Windermere residents, commuters, cyclists, and pedestrians, benefiting daily users of this critical intersection, which is currently operating over capacity.
