Activities include installing new pavement markings, upgraded signage, enhanced lighting, and pedestrian crossings for safety. Drainage improvements will support stormwater management. Engineering, design, and construction services will ensure efficient implementation. These upgrades will enhance traffic capacity, reduce congestion, and improve overall safety at the 6th Avenue and Main Street roundabout in Windermere.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The appropriation project will provide citizens with improved traffic flow, reduced congestion, and enhanced safety at the 6th Avenue and Main Street roundabout. Upgraded signage, lighting, and pavement markings will improve navigation and visibility. Pedestrian crossings will ensure safer access for all users.
