13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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OSC is requesting state appropriation funding for a new Rural Education Outreach program in collaboration with UF's Florida 4-H Youth Development Program to identify and connect with rural communities to provide school districts throughout Florida the assistance they need for their teachers and students to thrive. This initiative not only aims to improve student learning outcomes but also boosts teachers' confidence in their ability to deliver engaging and impactful science education.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

OSC's Rural Education Outreach program will provide focused workshops and customized teacher professional development training designed to meet the needs of each community by collaborating with rural school district administrators to identify specific Florida State Science Education standards where teachers need support to enhance science instruction.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

OSC will serve up to fifteen schools across five districts in rural counties. OSC Educators will travel to each school to provide in-classroom workshops focused on areas identified by the schools where their students are struggling. OSC will equip teachers with the tools and strategies needed to implement hands-on lessons effectively through standards-based professional development training.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Funding will allow OSC to support students attending schools in rural counties such as Osceola, Lake, Marion, Highlands, Desoto and Okeechobee counties, which include two (DeSoto and Okeechobee) that are among the lowest ranked school-grades in Florida. We anticipate that we will serve over 3,000 students and teachers through this program.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Empower children to be more competitive in science and math; Increased understanding and focus from teachers on "hard-to-understand" science and math concepts; Increased student confidence and interest in science and math concepts that gives them access to lucrative STEM careers. OSC will measure impact through pre and post surveys.
