13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds requested for the Belle Glade Road Improvement Project are intended to stabilize and revitalize critical roadways that have been compromised by unstable muck soil and heavy, constant traffic. Specifically, these funds will enable structural reinforcements, resurfacing, and enhanced drainage systems to ensure safe, durable road conditions. The ultimate goal is to protect public infrastructure, improve transportation safety, and promote long-term economic growth and community connectivity in this rural area.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will support a comprehensive range of activities and services specifically designed to address the challenges of Belle Glade's roadways, which are built on unstable muck soil that constantly shifts and deteriorates. Initially, detailed engineering studies - including geotechnical assessments and environmental impact analyses - will be conducted to understand the unique conditions and design tailored remediation strategies. This will be followed by a competitive bidding process to select qualified contractors with expertise in working with such challenging soils. During construction, rigorous project management and engineering oversight will ensure that all activities, such as road resurfacing, structural reinforcements, and the installation of enhanced drainage systems, are executed to the highest standards. These improvements will not only stabilize the roadways but also mitigate the effects of heavy traffic, reduce long-term maintenance costs, and enhance overall safety.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services provided by the appropriation project will include constructing safer, more resilient roadways that directly address the unique challenges of unstable muck soils. This project will involve comprehensive road resurfacing, structural reinforcement, and the installation of advanced drainage systems to reduce flooding and erosion. These improvements will ensure that residents experience smoother, more reliable travel, reducing vehicle damage and maintenance costs while enhancing emergency response times. Citizens will benefit from consistent access to essential services, schools, workplaces, and healthcare facilities, while local businesses will see improved logistics and reduced delays. Ultimately, these upgrades will boost public safety, foster community connectivity, and contribute to long-term economic stability.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this project encompasses the entire community of Belle Glade, including residents, local families, seniors, and children who rely on these roadways for daily commuting and access to essential services. Local businesses, farmers, and emergency responders also stand to benefit, as the improved infrastructure will facilitate the smoother transportation of goods and faster emergency response times. Based on current demographic data, approximately 20,000 individuals are expected to be served directly by these roadway improvements, while the enhanced connectivity and economic boost will indirectly benefit many more across the region.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of the Belle Glade Roadway Improvement Project is to create safer, more reliable, and longer-lasting infrastructure that directly enhances community safety, reduces travel delays, and supports local economic activity. By stabilizing roads built on unstable muck, reducing flooding, and mitigating wear from heavy traffic - including logistics trucks, agricultural machinery, and daily commuters - the project will improve emergency response times, lower vehicle maintenance costs, and provide a robust foundation for sustained regional growth. Outcomes will be measured through a combination of quantitative and qualitative methodologies. Quantitatively, performance metrics will include the frequency and severity of flooding events, reductions in road accidents, improvements in road surface condition indices, and emergency response times before and after the project. Additionally, maintenance logs and inspection reports will track long-term durability and cost savings.



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f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The contracting agency may impose liquidated damages following a monthly audit, provided that a written warning detailing the unmet deliverables or performance measures outlined in the contract has been issued and discussed. A financial deduction of \$1,000 per month will be applied until the deficiencies are fully remedied.
