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The project will improve traffic safety for a portion of SW 2nd St. by funding design and construction of safety countermeasures in the downtown area. These safety countermeasures are aimed at reducing the number of fatalities and serious injuries taking place on this street. The project includes an extension of Downtown bike lanes, high-visibility

crosswalks, and improving safety conditions at intersections. The project overlaps Top 100 High-Crash locations identified in the Vision Zero Framework. b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds? The funds will be used to design and build traffic safety improvements on SW 2nd St. The improvements will make the street safer for pedestrians, cyclists and drivers in a high-traffic area in Downtown Miami. c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project? The funds will be used for design and construction of traffic safety improvements. d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served? Students, residents, and the general public within the area. Over the course of several years after construction, thousands of people could benefit from improved safety within the project area. e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project?
