#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

FIBA will collaborate with Florida industry partners to identify their key technological challenges and then curate Israeli Al solutions that address these needs across all sectors, with a focus on hospitality, agriculture, and cybersecurity. FIBA will facilitate the deployment of these cutting-edge Israeli technologies to optimize operations, drive innovation, and enhance efficiency. This will positively impact Florida's economy by creating new jobs, expanding the presence of Israeli companies, and attracting investment dollars into the state. Introducing Al solutions to Florida's businesses is crucial for enhancing productivity, fostering innovation, and ensuring the state remains competitive in an increasingly technology-driven global economy.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

FIBA will facilitate partnerships between Israeli AI companies and Florida businesses through industry-specific workshops, technology demonstrations, and pilot programs. The initiative will integrate Israeli AI solutions into key sectors like hospitality, agriculture, healthcare and cybersecurity, driving innovation, job creation, and economic growth. Activities will include identifying and connecting Israeli companies to Florida industry partners, fostering partnerships with local investors, and encouraging Israeli companies to open US subsidiaries in Florida. FIBA will also provide ongoing support, in collaboration with Florida's economic development organizations, to help Israeli companies relocate and grow their businesses in the state.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

FIBA's activities will provide Florida citizens with access to advanced Israeli AI technologies in hospitality, healthcare, agriculture, cybersecurity, and other sectors, improving services like personalized medical care, efficient food production, and enhanced public safety. Through partnerships, job creation, and pilot programs, citizens will benefit from improved quality of life and economic opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Statewide, the population will benefit from the deployment of proven Israeli AI technologies that enhance operational efficiency, productivity, and service delivery across key sectors like hospitality, agriculture, cybersecurity, and healthcare. FIBA's initiative will address specific challenges AI can solve, including optimizing crop yields and resource use in agriculture, improving patient care and diagnosis in healthcare, streamlining operations and personalizing experiences in hospitality, and strengthening threat detection and response in cybersecurity, benefiting numerous Florida residents across these industries.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefits of this project include increased productivity, innovation, and job creation across Florida's key industries, driven by the integration of Israeli AI technologies. In agriculture, AI will optimize crop yields and resource usage; in healthcare, it will enhance diagnostic accuracy and treatment outcomes; in hospitality, it will improve customer experiences and operational efficiency; and in cybersecurity, it will strengthen threat detection and response. These benefits will be measured by tracking improvements in key performance indicators such as revenue growth, cost savings, efficiency gains, customer satisfaction, and job creation. Additionally, regular evaluations through industry feedback, data analytics, and performance assessments will ensure the continued impact of AI solutions across Florida.
