Since 1986, becaused on in-fill construction in existing neighborhoods and has served more than 200 local families of 6 of median income. Habitat for Humanity provides affordable homeownership by serving as both the bank. We provide a zero-interest mortgage and base mortgage payments on 25% of our homeowner's have a total of 40 homes with 8 single-family houses and 16 duplexes. The funding request will support irst 10 homes which in turn - through the homeowner mortgage payments - will help to fund the 10 the development. Because Habitat for Humanity uses all mortgage payments to fund the next homes, request will impact the building of all 40 homes in Legacy Woods.

#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Request for funds for construction of new houses for affordable homeownership. Total cost estimate for construction of ten (10) new houses is \$2,000,000 of which \$1,600,000 will be funded by individual, private house sponsorship donations. Appropriations received from the State of Florida will be applied to four key phases of construction: foundation, masonry, plumbing, and electrical.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Hiring of local sub-contractors to complete the foundation, masonry, plumbing, and electrical phases of residential construction. Habitat for Humanity of GVC Construction Site Supervisors will provide oversight as part of our match.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Opportunities for affordable homeownership to citizens of low-income, specifically those within 40-80% of median income. It is important to note that Habitat Homeowners are already living in the community but in sub-standard housing conditions. They are working in our community, holding essential jobs in the medical field as CNA's and Patient Techs, in hospitality, in manufacturing, in our school system as teacher aides and school bus drivers.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Individuals and families of lower income - specifically 40-80% of median income. 2024-2025 Median Income in Volusia County is \$82,800. For a household of four - the range for 40-80% is between \$33,120 and \$66,240 and adjusted accordingly for household size.

Legacy Woods will provide 40 new homes - eight single-family and sixteen duplexes in a mix of two and three bedrooms. Habitat for Humanity of GVC will provide a zero-interest mortgage to each homeowner and monthly payments will be based on 25% of homeowner's monthly income. All mortgage payments will build equity for the homeowner and Habitat will use them as cash flow to build the next homes. Approximately

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Affordable and sustainable homeownership for individuals and families of low income. Stability in housing with ownership.

Increased outcomes in school/education due to stability and improved well-being in a quality-built home.

Better health due to quality-built home vs. rentals not kept up to code, mold issues, etc.

Ability to save with a monthly housing burden that does not exceed 30% of income - providing for emergency funds. Outcomes will be measured by Homeowner Impact Survey and regular monthly mortgage payments.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

HFH of GVC is committed to the completion of this development and has served the community since 1986. All of the necessary partners for house sponsorships have committed funding and we are ready to submit permits as soon as the infrastructure is complete which is anticipated by end of April 2025. We plan to begin building houses by July 2025. If a circumstance arose outside of our control that did not allow us to build these houses, and we had been awarded the requested funds, we would return the funds to the State of Florida.
