#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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These funds will allow the University to strengthen its security measures and controls, particularly our technology, emergency signage, and cyberinfrastructure.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This project would provide the following essential upgrades: integrate key offices onto the campus network; replace the existing VOiP system with one that supports critical emergency services; replace faulty wiring and network switches and access points; implement digital signage to provide real-time emergency alerts and improve wayfinding; replace outdated servers, computers, and other equipment; and, implement the Huntress platform to enhance MS Office 365 to include cyberattack protections such as endpoint security and robust backup capabilities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Services provided to citizens in the surrounding community include enhancing the security and speed of the existing free wifi network. Guests will also be more protected from cyberattacks and data intrusions while on campus.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is the students, faculty, staff, and guests of Edward Waters University. Approximately 10,000 people will be served annually to include daily activities and larger-scaled events such as commencement, athletic competitions, and other activities.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefit of this project will be a safer, more secure, and efficient campus.

Measurables include: a significant increase in serviceable technology equipment, increased wifi speed, decreased latency, presence of wayfinding signage versus current non-presence, and a decrease in network intrusion.
