4. Project/Program Description

The City of Starke has been partnered with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection to address ongoing drinking water system issues in water treatment, storage, and distribution. Items identified for upgrade/expansion include water mains, service laterals, valves and meters. Recent transportation improvements created by the Florida Department of Transportation rerouted traffic from the downtown area to a new US 301 Bypass. The loss of traffic has impacted the downtown Community Revitalization Area (CRA) and the City expects the result to impact the current tax base of the City of Starke, Bradford County and the State of Florida. Economic analysis performed by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity demonstrates a loss to rural communities that are bypassed by state or federal highways where utilities are not expanded to interchange areas.
