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13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To acquire new radio and dispatch equipment for the new Union County EOC / 911 Center. This equipment will enhance the communication capabilities for all agencies within the county, including the Sheriff's Office, Fire Rescue, and other county / city departments. The goal is to ensure efficient and reliable communication during emergencies, which is crucial for the safety and well-being of all residents in Union County. Union County is fiscally constrained and cannot afford this on our own.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds requested will support several key activities and services: 1) Acquisition of Equipment 2) Installation and Setup 3) Training for 911 Personnel / Dispatchers 4) Maintenance and Support 5) Improved Response Times 6) Interagency Coordination. These activities and services will ensure that the Union County 911 Center can provide reliable and efficient communication for all.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funds requested will provide several direct services to all citizens of Union County: 1) Enhanced Emergency Response 2) Increased Public Safety 3) Comprehensive Coverage 4) Support for All Agencies 5) Community Confidence. These services will directly benefit the citizens of Union County by ensuring that emergency services can respond quickly and efficiently.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project targets most groups who are not already incarcerated or in mental health care. This includes specific groups, such as elderly persons, persons with poor mental / physical health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless, developmentally disabled, physically disabled, preschool students, grade school students, high school students, formerly incarcerated persons, victims of crime, etc. Approximately 16,500 residents will be served (entirety of Union County).

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will provide the following benefits: 1) Enhanced Emergency Response 2) Improved Coordination 3) Reliable Communication 4) Crime Prevention 5) Disaster Preparedness. Response time analysis, incident outcome evaluation, crime rate statistics, public safety surveys, interagency coordination metrics, school safety metrics, and training and usage reports can all be measured.
