#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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To provide services to moderate to high risk youth offenders and families that will help them achieve positive & sustainable long-term impacts. PLL is one of the only evidence based models in the country proven to have high family engagement, lower recidivism rates, lower residential placements, & lower reentry into residential placement. Parents are better prepared & equipped to handle the youth coming back home. PLL works with the entire family, so the siblings in the household will also benefit to address their issues. PLL will not only stabilizes the family, but it is also a complete family trauma model.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Youth & their families involved in the juvenile justice system will participate in multi-family groups, individual therapy & case management services. PLL teams will travel to residential commitment facilities and family homes. In addition, transportation for youth & families is provided. To maintain fidelity to evidence-based model outcomes, PLL therapist teams will participate in certified PLL training and weekly clinical consultation.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Youth & their families involved in the juvenile justice system will receive the following direct services: skills-based training (research indicates that this is the best type of treatment for at risk families), individual & family therapy including family trauma, crisis intervention, & case management services. PLL staff teams will travel to residential commitment facilities, to family homes, and/or provide transportation to clients & families to complete goal-directed activities. Youth placed in residential commitment facilities outside of driving distance from home will receive HIPPA compliant virtual services. PLL case managers provide community-based team meetings to wrap services around the youth when he returns

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Targeted population to be served are youth 10 - 18 years who are moderate to high risk offenders returning home from a DJJ residential commitment facility or are youth who have recently returned home from a residential facility. This funding will provide for one team serving up to 30 families annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Youth participating in this program will be less likely to to re-enter the juvenile or the adult corrections system. The purpose is to reduce recidivism by keeping youth ages 10-18 years from violating their probation conditions resulting in re-arrest. PLL has a dashboard that tracks the family engagement and success rates. Additionally, PLL does a mental health behavior pre/post outcome at the end of each contract year using the validated instruments of the child behavior checklist and the FACES IV. These results are provided to the service delivery provider and the department.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The contract is performance based. If the services are not delivered then payment is not received. PLL has agreed to
