4. Project/Program Description

Sanibel's shared use path system (26 miles) experienced damage from the storm surge wash over and subsequent damage from debris placement on the ROW from Hurricanes Ian, Helene, and Milton. Sanibel is requesting funds to repair/repave and elevate where needed, approximately 10-12 miles of the shared use path system. The system is critical in supporting resident transportation year round and heavy use by visitors during the busy tourist season. During various times of the year, Sanibel's roadway system, which also provides the only access to Captiva (unincorporated Lee County), is congested and the shared use path provides a safe and well used alternative means of transportation that is separated from vehicular travel ways.
