If residents and leagues are fortunate to get playing time they are limited to a specific time period so others can be accommodated. The City will construct a new soccer complex. Project improvements include: one(1) adult and three (3) youth soccer fields, LED field lighting, parking facilities, concession building and restroom facilities, maintenance storage facility, water, wastewater and electric utility connections, landscaping enhancement and field irrigation.

#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



The construction of a new soccer complex (1 adult field and 3 youth fields) allows for additional fields for soccer leagues, residents, practice times and pick up games for the community. Additionally, the current 2 complexes lack restroom facilities and field lights that heavily restrict the community's use of the facilities. Both existing complexes routinely exceeding capacity based on these restrictions. This project will provide additional fields and will create a more familyoriented soccer facilities for the community. Based on its location and the ability of residents in a low-moderate income neighborhood to walk to the new facility the City is creating better access for recreational needs.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The new complex focuses as a family-oriented soccer facilities. While it is located contiguous to a low-moderate income neighborhood, additional adult and youth leagues, as well as the City's residents will be able to utilize the new facility. The new fields will allow for more league use, practice areas, pick-up games by friends and co-workers, etc.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide the following direct services: safe/secure lighted parking facilities, concession stands, restroom facilities and 4 lighted soccer fields. Also because of its location adjacent to the City's existing dog park, families, local residents, visitors can entertain all members of the family with different opportunities for recreation.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Local adult and youth soccer leagues, the general public, occasional visitors and surrounding communities will be able to utilize the facilities. The City expects to accommodate over 800 individuals per week in season.

## e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

### be measured?

The addition of more fields in the community provides more adult and youth leagues to take advantage of additional soccer time. The additional fields also reduces or eliminates the strict play time the City has to impose on existing players to use the fields. Based on the location of the new complex it also allows residents in the adjacent low-moderate income neighborhood to walk or bike to the new soccer complex.
