#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To meet the growing demands of the service district to include high pass rates, successful job placement, and high employer satisfaction rates. Requests will assist in a collegewide salary study to engage in a comprehensive analysis of the College's salary schedule. Eight faculty, six student services positions, operations/maintenance, and administrative personnel will assist with efforts to meet the demand for program expansion and positive student success outcomes for a growing rural region.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

SFSC will hire additional faculty and student support service positions to meet the growing demands in key areas. Efforts will assist to meet the need for program expansion and positive student success outcomes.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

SFSC will provide opportunity for post secondary attainment in degrees and certifications for our service district. Provision of qualified and competent graduates that enter the local workforce that will inevitably benefit local business and drive economic growth.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target audience is K-12, college students, unemployed, and underemployed. Students and employees will receive education to enter a high-wage, high-demand career field.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

An increase to faculty and student advising/counseling will help meet student demand in specific disciplines as well as high-demand workforce programs such as IT, business, and health sciences which have seen increases in demand. Increase percentage of students and employees as evidenced by positive outcomes such as program completion, employment, and license attainment.
