offices, classrooms, dance studio, bathrooms, locker rooms, and workout space. During natural disasters or other emergencies, the 31,7000 square foot expansion will serve as a Category 3 Hurricane

shelter.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

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The STARS Complex expansion project's goal is to increase services and capability to an existing, municipally owned facility to provide critical services to an under served community. The facility will be designed resiliently with the ability to function as a hurricane shelter in the event of a weather related emergency.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The STARS Complex expansion will house a new gymnasium, auditorium, kitchen space, offices, classrooms, dance studio, bathroom, locker rooms, and workout space. Along with this wide variety of community-building programming, the STARS Complex also serves as a community resource center during natural disasters and other emergencies.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The STARS Complex expansion project will lead to job creation to manage essential programs, reduce recidivism, provide important after school care, and offer safe refuge to under served populations. This project will also provide emergency protective services to a historically under served community and provide essential opportunities for distribution, emergency aid, and resources.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The total number of beneficiaries, within City of Fort Myers, is 96,000. The highest concentration of very Low Moderate-income residents reside in the immediate areas surrounding the STARS Complex. While the entire population of City of Fort Myers will be served by this project, the targeted population is the 49,910 (51.99%) Low Moderate-income citizens that will benefit the most from these critical services the expansion would provide.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The current STARS Complex serves over 30,000 City residents per year, with over 60% residing within walking distance of the facility. At completion of the expansion, the City anticipates the improved facilities and programs will create an increase in the number of users as well as an increase in usage frequency. During the STARS Complex Redevelopment public workshop, May 2019, only 27% indicated participation in activities/ programs siting lack of space, programing for teens/adults, parking, and year-round activities as basis for not utilizing.
