a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

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The goal of this funding is to build a new infant/toddler center to increase the number of quality early childhood slots (N=58) in the Tampa/Hillsborough community, renovate an existing campus for 3-5-year-olds (N=118) and buildout a food pantry and produce garden to address families' food insecurities. The proposed project will change three city blocks in a blighted area of the East Tampa Community and should be replicated in other communities similar to the East Tampa Community.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

A high-quality environment will be created to provide services to young children at a most crucial time during their brains' development. The high-quality environment plus the instructional services provided will support these children to be ready to read on the third-grade level by third grade. Moreover, parents will be able to secure childcare services for their young children that will enable them to engage in the workforce, and businesses will have access to the intellectual capital needed to produce profits for their businesses.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

A high-quality early childhood environment will be created to 1) offer working parents a secure quality environment for their young children, 2) improve businesses access to a 'ready' workforce, 3) reduce employees' absences, 4) improve young children's preparedness to successfully navigate the K-12 schooling process, 5) help families to address their food insecurities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Young children, ages 6-weeks to 5 years. A total of 176 infants/toddlers to children ages 5 years old.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Young children (six weeks to 5 years old) will have a quality environment in which to receive instruction to prepare them to successfully navigate the K-12 schooling process. The metrics to measure success: 1) reduced children's absentee rates; 2) reduced parents' absentee rates from the workforce due to lack of early childhood services; 3) increase parents' advocacy skills that will lead to a more stabilized family unit; and 4) healthier family units.
