13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Improve the quality of education: Improve kindergarten readiness for military families and provide affordable ample childcare options for military children with extended hours including weekends for drop-in childcare. Provide those who protect our freedoms with affordable childcare while they serve our country. This is specific to members serving out of the Mac Dill air force base.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Active military families will receive childcare vouchers, childcare facilities that choose to remain open during extended hours will receive funding, owners and newcomers who choose to build centers near the military base will receive a tax credit toward start-up costs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Children of military families will receive affordable early education, military parents will receive financial relief, childcare centers that choose to open for extended hours to serve the military children will be eligible for tax credits, and childcare business owners who choose to build childcare centers or childcare family homes near a military facility will receive a start-up tax credit.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

As a pilot, this Military Childcare Act is specific to members serving out of the Mac Dill air force base.
