### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This funding request will support improvements to the North Florida Fairgrounds property transforming an under-utilized space into a vibrant, equitable community hub that fosters development, attracts residents, and supports local businesses.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Fairgrounds Beautification and Improvement is a visionary project designed to maximize the property's potential as a dynamic community hub. This request will support improvements to the North FL Fairgrounds including new Capital Park ballfields; central green with pavilions; parking improvements around Gene Cox Stadium; improved fair operations; stormwater/utility upgrades; pad-ready redevelopment sites; and renovations to existing buildings with new meeting space and restrooms.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Fairgrounds Beautification and Improvement is a visionary project designed to maximize the property's potential as a dynamic community hub. Through this investment, into a vibrant, equitable community hub that fosters Job creation during construction and on-going operation; economic resilience through diversified event offerings; and support for local cultural and community events.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All residents of and visitors to Leon County will benefit from this project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Focused investments at the existing North Florida Fairgrounds could generate additional economic impacts, such as increased direct spending by visitors staying in paid accommodations, by supporting new or expanded fair uses. The improvements also include constructing stormwater ponds with beautification, walking paths, and amenities, and upgrades to water, sewer, and electric utility infrastructure. These improvements are needed to meet current land development regulations as improvements are made on the site. The Fairgrounds Master Plan and Market Feasibility Report identify measurements of benefits within the stormwater and utility upgrades design and the economic impact analysis sections respectively.
