13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will be used to expand access to critical medical services and health education, focusing on early detection and intervention for chronic diseases, diabetes, and cancers such as breast, colon, and prostate. The goal is to improve health outcomes, empower individuals with the knowledge and resources to manage their health proactively, and enhance the quality of life for residents in targeted counties.



b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will support activities and services designed to enhance access to healthcare and promote preventive care. These include point of care services, such as heart echocardiograms, continuous glucose monitoring for diabetics, and mobile mammogram screenings. Additionally, health education and outreach initiatives will raise awareness about these issues and the importance of regular cancer screenings (e.g., breast, colon and prostate). Structured training and educational workshops will also be conducted to provide individuals with the knowledge and tools needed to make informed decisions about their health. These efforts aim to improve health outcomes and empower individuals to take proactive steps toward managing their well-being.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The appropriation project will provide citizens with direct access to essential medical services and educational resources focused on improving health outcomes. These services include point-of-care services, such as heart echocardiograms, continuous glucose monitoring for diabetics, and mobile mammogram screenings.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population consists of individuals living in select Florida counties (Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, Orange, Madison, Charlotte, Hardee and Desoto). Services will be available to all individuals, with an estimated 2,500 people expected to benefit annually from the screenings, educational programs, and outreach efforts.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this project is to improve health outcomes through enhanced early detection, management and education about diabetes, chronic diseases, and cancers such as breast, colon, and prostate cancer. The project aims to increase access to life-saving medical services while raising health literacy about preventive care and chronic disease management. To measure these outcomes, a comprehensive methodology will be employed. Quantitative data will be collected to track the number of screenings, diagnoses, referrals, and participants in educational sessions. Pre- and post-program evaluations will assess knowledge gains and behavioral changes among participants. Follow-up care data will be analyzed to evaluate treatment initiation rates and long-term improvements in health outcomes. Additionally, participant feedback surveys will be conducted to gauge satisfaction and the perceived impact of the services provided.

Suggested penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures, in addition to the contracting agency's standard penalties, may include several actions. Financial penalties proportional to unmet deliverables or delays could also be imposed to incentivize timely and accurate completion of tasks.
