Due to nationwide supply shortages, the Town is not set to receive the replacement vehicle until January 2026. The Town is requesting that the funding be reappropriated. Davie Fire Rescue primarily provides the emergency service needs on I-595, I-75, Florida's Turnpike and is one of the agencies to service along US-27.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Re-appropriate funding allocated in FY 20204-2025 for the replacement of one fire unit: 161706 a 2010 International fire rescue with 164,000 miles and 12,476 engine hours equivalent to 360,000 miles. The unit has exceeded its life cycle and requires increased repair costs, downtime, and diminished response time. Due to a nationwide shortage, the Town estimates it cannot obtain a replacement vehicle until January 2026.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The Town of Davie Fire Rescue Ambulance will provide services within the Town's service area as well as mutual aid to other local municipalities. Davie Fire Rescue Department (DFRD) responds to over 15,000 calls in 2022, average call per month is 1,200 calls per month and an average of 48 calls per shift. This includes over 1,200 calls I-595, I-75, Florida's Turnpike, and US-27.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Davie Fire Rescue responds to over 15,000 calls per year. The vehicle will be used to assist in provided emergency services to the residents and patrons n within the Town. The Town of Davie is one of the primary responding agencies for the the major highways including I-595, I-75, Florida Turnpike, and assists with some calls along US-27.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Town has 100,000 residents as well as businesses, post-secondary institutions, hospitals, etc. Davie Fire Rescue responds to over 15,000 calls per year. The vehicle will be used to assist in provided emergency services to the residents and patrons n within the Town. The Town of Davie is one of the primary responding agencies for the the major highways including I-595, I-75, Florida Turnpike, and assists with some calls along US-27.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Provide emergency services to the community, help to stabilize Fleet Cost, improve reliability, increase Fire Suppression Capabilities, help to maintain the Town's Class 1 Public Protection Classification (PPC) Insurance Services Office (ISO) Ratings and provide services to the growing population. Measured by: Response times, updated fleet to respond to the growing community needs, and enhanced services to the community.
