Vista Park currently has five (5) acres of undeveloped land on the north portion of the park. The City's recently approved Parks and Recreation Master Plan identified the need for additional indoor space for the community, with Vista Park being an ideal location. The facility will include a gymnasium with an elevated track and multi-purpose rooms. Vista Park is currently identified as a Point of Distribution (POD) during emergency events. The new facility will serve as a reunification site as well.
