The funds would be used to purchase and print 9 million plastic bags for distribution by the USPS. Providing bags has shown to dramatically increase the amount of food donated. Most recently, when bags were provided to residential customers, approximately 12 MILLION pounds of food were collected.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Plastic bags would be distributed for free by the USPS to 9 million residential households statewide. Bags with their food donations will be collected by letter carriers on the day of the food drive and then all distributed to local food banks to feed the hungry.

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With bags, we can expect to collect 11 to 12 MILLION POUNDS of food to be distributed locally to food banks statewide to feed the hungry

Hungry citizens across the state. All local food banks.

With bags, we can expect to collect 11 to 12 MILLION POUNDS of food statewide to be distributed locally to feed the hungry. The food totals are weighed each year.
