The project is the construction of a new animal shelter which will provide a adequate facility and critically needed resources to provide for the hundred of animals Taylor County shelters annually. The County is the sole provider of animal control, The shelter is currently located in a structure constructed in 1957 which does not have adequate climate control, ventilation, and natural light. There have been on going drainage issues as the building was not originally constructed for use as an animal shelter. A study completed by the University of Florida has provided the County insight on shelter needs and facility requirements.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose is the construction of a new animal shelter that will provide a safe and healthy environment with adequate climate control, drainage, ventilation, and natural light. The shelter will have adequate sizes of kennels and separate dog and cat areas. The facility will have exercise areas as well as a meet and greet area which will aid in adoptions. A study conducted by the University of Florida Maddie's Shelter Medicine Program has outlined the County's sheltering needs and will be used to assist the County in the planning of the new shelter.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The new facility will provide adequate facilities to care for both dogs and cats who are in the custody of Taylor County Animal Control. The shelter will be constructed to meet needs in a safe and healthy environment for both the animals and humans who provide for the care and services needed to place the animals in forever homes. Numbers have continued to rise of animals who are in the care of Animal Control and it is hoped the new facility will increase adoptions, assistance from transfer organizations and rescues, and volunteers.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Taylor County is the sole provider of animal control in the County. Direct services will be a facility which will provide adequate services and care in the hopes of increasing adoptions and rescue services from other agencies better equipped to place animals in homes and better situations with a decrease in euthanasia. The new building will provide for a facility that is adequately equipped to serve as an animal shelter. The current facility was constructed in 1957 and is quite antiquated and was not designed or constructed to serve as a shelter.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All citizens in Taylor County (21,582) will be served by the animal shelter as well as animal rescue groups and volunteers who assist the County with adoptions and/or fostering, medical care, and donations. Taylor County Board of Commissioners is the sole provider of animal control services and the humane investigation thereof in the County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The facility will provide adequate climate control, ventilation, nature light, storage areas for supplies and food There will be separate areas to efficiently accommodate dogs and cats with kennels with adequate space to accommodate various sizes of animals including mothers with their puppies or kittens. The new facility will provide sufficient areas for outdoor exercise. In addition, the new facility will have a meet and greet area which is essential for potential adopters to meet animals in need of homes in a friendly and safe environment.

Due to the need of the Shelter , Taylor County will move forward with the construction of the new shelter when funding is secured. The project will be complete within funding contract timelines and all deliverables will be met.
