13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Create a more skilled workforce for Florida by building interest in middle grade students in high-demand careers in STEM, computer science, and CTE (Career and Technical Education). Studies have shown that introducing these careers earlier and in the context of real-world problems increases student desire to follow these pathways that businesses need the most. This provides actionable resources and connections for educators allowing them to deliver a more robust experience for all students.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Continue to provide statewide access to supplemental academic lessons and hands-on activities that any teacher can utilize without the need for any additional purchases. Teachers in Florida and 12 other states have completed nearly 12,000,000 lessons using this. These efforts will also allow teachers to be trained and connected to other educators statewide at no additional cost

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This will continue to provide Learning Blade to all schools statewide. It provides 13 "Missions" that involve students in grand problems that show the careers and skills that would solve these in real life. To date the program has served over 24,000 students in Florida.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Over 24,000 grade school students and high school students in Florida.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will increase student awareness and interest in high-demand careers in STEM, computer science and CTE. This will be measured by the number of lessons completed, the number of schools enrolled, and by surveys of students and teachers participating in the program. Students in Florida and other states have completed nearly 12,000,000 lessons in this program. Summary reports will be provided after every semester of the project.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The standard penalty for a program such as this would be to not renew it for the next school year. However, the Learning Blade program has never failed to be renewed for failure to meet deliverables or performance in any other 9 statewide contracts, which have been in progress for up to 8 consecutive years.
