Training School—Aviation, as well as Associated Builders & Contractors: 1. Provide scholarships to underserved Blanche Ely High School students to access technical education. 2. Equip students with the necessary skills and certifications to fulfill vital roles in the new downtown, spanning trades, services, healthcare, and technology sectors. 3. Create pathways to secure stable, well-paying jobs. 4. Address labor needs to support.
c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
Up to 50 \$5,000 scholarships with an emphasis on programs with internships and apprenticeships.

50 youth (18 - 25) – recent high school graduates initially through Blanche Ely High School but possibly young adults up to age 25 residing in the targeted market.

Benefit: Enhancing an individual's economic sufficiency by creating a viable alternative for economically underserved youth with a track to employment through internships and/or apprenticeships upon successful completion of a program. Method: 70% graduate and be employed in the field within 6 months or continue education track.
