a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Increase attendance by revitalizing the oldest part of CMAs facility to welcome new species by the end of 2026. Provide rescued, non-releasable marine life with environmentally appropriate habitats where they can educate patrons on their conservation message.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Remodel the former Winter Zone, including the adjacent pools, walkways and stairwells, elevator, viewing areas, and elevator. Prepare to house sea lions by seeking funding for pinniped care, staff professional development, and program development. Develop marketing and sponsorship opportunities to share the addition of sea lions to attract increased and new patrons.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

CMA attracts visitors from throughout the state, US and worldwide, driving tourism and generating substantial economic impact for Clearwater and the broader region. Sixty percent of CMAs guests are tourists, further boosting the local economy. Forty percent are Florida residents. The aquarium's educational programs, conservation efforts, and scientific research benefit the community and help preserve marine life. Our research indicates that this new habitat would attract even more visitors to CMA, as sea lions are a popular attraction at aquariums.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

CMA visitors are the target population served by this project. CMA hosts over 300,000 guests, the addition of sea lions will increase admission.

Outcomes include highlighting a new marine species and it's plight, while attracting new visitors from the Tampa Bay are and worldwide.
