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Design and build-out technology corporate fronts with leading corporations in the State. These corporate fronts provide state of the art hands-on experiences to middle school students. This project will demonstrate the ability to successfully bring together public and private entities for the benefit of students, education and Florida's future job market. Economic development through incentives to bring new and/or highlight companies in the emerging/disruptive technology industry for students and the community. Development of a nation and statewide model for learning. Deep, experiential center development for student learning.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

High-tech corporations will develop learning modules in partnership with PCS and in consultation with ARK Invest analysts to recreate actual operations taking place within their corporations. Students will engage and learn about various disruptive technologies that are shaping the present and future world and workforce. Students will benefit by learning about these technologies as well as understanding what it takes to study and participate in these select industries.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Center will support Florida State Standards in a variety of subject areas such as engineering, physics, biology, finance, economics, environmental sciences, computer programming, medical sciences and technology education, etc. Students will be studying and preparing for their visit to the Center and complete follow-up lessons when completed.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Over 5,000 students annually. Neighboring school districts that utilize the Center for student experiences/field trips. Entire state, as the Center will serve as a statewide model for visits and information as other districts learn to replicate the model.
