programs and services for more youth and families.

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Boys & Girls Clubs of the Suncoast, Tarpon Springs Learning Center creates a safe location for teens, in this under served community, to play sports, learn workforce readiness skills ,and prepare to graduate from high school with a plan for their future. Being able to utilize the space efficiently (enclosing) allows for increased programs and services for more youth (and their families) in the Tarpon Spring and the North Pinellas County area.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

With the assistance of BGCS youth development professionals, qualified teachers and behavioral specialists, the Tarpon Springs Learning Center will provide empowerment programs that teach youth the fundamentals of self-awareness, healthy lifestyles, academic support, healthy relationships, and soft skills necessary for employment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improved economic activities in the Tarpon Springs area will increase through employment of local residences at the Club. More youth served, means more teachers, coaches and club directors needed to guide youth in positive ways.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Boys & Girls Clubs of the Suncoast provides high quality out of school time Club experiences proven to ensure our young people, especially those that need us most, are on track to graduate from high school with a plan for the future, demonstrate good character and citizenship, and live a healthy lifestyle. The proposed project will further engage and grow the number of youth served in the Tarpon Springs community.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Boys & Girls Clubs of the Suncoast - Tarpon Springs Club is in need of a capital expansion to accommodate additional kids and teens that otherwise would go unserved. The project will allow over 400 kids to now have safe space to go after school while engaging in academic support programming, receive hot nutritious meals daily, and participate in enriching character development. Methodology: Quantitative: Pre/post assessments; report card reflecting grade improvement and amount of meals served will be collected.; - Qualitative: outcome-driven instruction using evidence-based programs developed by Boys & Girls Clubs of America, measured using the National Youth Outcome Initiative survey.
