### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Through collaboration with stakeholders, strategies will be developed to recruit and retain highly qualified nursing and allied health faculty, leading to an increased number of graduates from these programs. These graduates will fill critical job openings in health institutions, improving the physical health and well-being of patients by enhancing the quality and timeliness of care.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funding will enable more students to enroll in nursing and allied health programs, resulting in a greater number of qualified graduates. This will help address workforce shortages, leading to improved patient care. Health institutions will experience reduced response times, shorter ER wait times, and more timely attention to patients' needs during admissions.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct services will be provided through a reduction in the number of overworked healthcare employees, as more qualified graduates fill open nursing and allied health positions. This will improve the physical and mental well-being of healthcare workers while enhancing the quality of care and outcomes for patients.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population to be served by the project include the following: high school students, university/college students, elderly person, persons with poor mental or physical health, jobless person, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youths, developmentally and physically disabled persons, drug users in the health services, and all nursing and allied health faculty. We estimate the number of individuals to be served by this program to be greater than 800.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

With highly qualified faculty for the nursing and allied health programs within the state college programs, it facilitates the increase of students it can educate in these fields. The will be measured by the number of students filling much needed positions at the Health institutions. The income of the faculty and students finding employment will filter to the community. It will also be measured by the number of faculty positions being filled, the number of students graduating from the nursing and allied health programs finding employment.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

College funding will be reduced if student retention rates are not maintained and if students fail to complete the educational program within the expected timeframe. However, a strategic plan for program delivery will address these challenges by implementing measures to improve success rates, such as recruiting and retaining highly qualified faculty. These efforts are expected to enhance student graduation rates and increase the overall number of program graduates.
