### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The CEPD will remove up to 100 Australian pines to protect public safety and property from prevent hazardous windfall damage, reduce beach erosion, and enhance dune restoration. The CEPD will also remove up to 1,500 iguanas to protect native birds, reptiles and amphibians, reduce damage to gardens and landscaping, and prevent undermining of sea walls and other structures from their burrows.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Requested funds will be used to cover the costs of removing hazardous Australian pines and nuisance iguanas.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The CEPD will contract with an arborist and tree removal specialist to cut down up to 100 Australian pines and remove or grind stumps and contract with an animal control specialist to trap and remove up to 1500 iguanas from Captiva Island.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project will benefit Captiva residents, businesses, and over 180,000 yearly visitors.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The removal of Australian pines, which are classified as a Category I invasive species in Florida, will improve native plant communities and enhance dune restoration. The removal of invasive iguanas will enhance native bird, reptile, and amphibian populations from egg depredation, as well as native plants from consumption. The removal of up to 100 Australian pines will protect public safety and property from prevent hazardous windfall damage and reduce beach erosion. Wildlife monitoring and tree surveys post removal will measure results.
