To reduce flooding, recommended improvements aim to enhance stormwater management and water quality, as well as roadway conditions and traffic flow.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

After the project is designed and approved, it will address environmental risks linked to stormwater runoff and enhance the quality of local surface water.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Based on hydrologic and hydraulic calculations, the existing drainage infrastructure does not discharge quickly enough to meet the desired performance. Improvements to drainage infrastructure will address these inadequacies. The project will remove flood waters from roadways. and reduce flood stages and durations.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

No direct services will be provided to residents. Once the project has been designed and permitted, flooding from rainfall will be mitigated, which will protect persons and property in the residential area. Additionally, ponding stormwater runoff from roadways will be removed, making bicycle and vehicle traffic safer.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Residents residing in the area of NE 53rd Street and NE 29th Avenue towards NE 53rd Court. The northern boundary is between NE 53rd Street and NE 53rd Court and the southern limit of the project is to be taken north of NE 51st Street. The extent of the proposed work is bound on the west past the intersection of NE 53rd Street and NE 29th Avenue and ends in the east toward the intersection of NE 53rd Street and NE 30th Terrace.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Once the project has been designed and permitted, the addition of catch basins with an underground stormwater network will address observed ponding and other drainage impacts to the area. The existing outfall pipe will be upsized and connected to a storm pipe, and additional pipes will be added along NE 53rd Street and NE 29th Avenue. The approach for measuring the outcome will involve site assessments, observations, and input from the community.
