The funds will modernize Orlando's city nursery, enhancing native plant propagation, improving irrigation systems, and expanding community education on sustainable landscaping. This initiative will reduce maintenance costs, improve stormwater management, and increase urban tree canopy, fostering environmental conservation and long-term sustainability while empowering residents to adopt cost-effective, eco-friendly practices.

The funds will support nursery modernization, tree propagation, and community education. Activities include upgrading irrigation systems, improving greenhouse materials, and enhancing soil quality to promote sustainable plant growth. Expanded cultivation and distribution of native species will help reduce maintenance costs and improve environmental resilience. Educational workshops will provide hands-on training in sustainable landscaping, water conservation, and tree care. Community engagement efforts, including tree giveaways and outreach programs, will encourage public participation in conservation efforts and promote long-term environmental stewardship.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide direct services including free tree and plant distributions, hands-on training in sustainable landscaping, and educational workshops on water conservation and native plant care. Residents will have access to expert-led programs that promote Florida-friendly gardening and urban reforestation. These services will enhance green spaces, improve environmental sustainability, and reduce community landscaping costs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project will serve Orlando residents, including homeowners, students, seniors, and community groups interested in sustainable landscaping and conservation. It will also benefit economically disadvantaged individuals by providing free trees and educational resources. An estimated 400 to 800 individuals will be directly served annually through workshops, training sessions, and tree distribution events, promoting long-term environmental and economic benefits.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

The project will enhance environmental sustainability, reduce maintenance costs, and improve community engagement in conservation efforts. Expected benefits include increased native plant coverage, improved stormwater management, and reduced urban heat. Outcomes will be measured through GIS mapping to track plant distribution, temperature and air quality monitoring, workshop attendance records, and community surveys assessing knowledge retention and participation in sustainable practices.
