In 2023 the Florida Legislature approved the Apalachicola Stewardship Act, authorizing an annual expenditure of up to \$5 million to the City of Apalachicola to improve surface water and groundwater quality within the Apalachicola Area of Critical State Concern through the completion of projects in the city's Area of Critical State Concern Work Plan. The legislative intent of the 2023 bill and the 1985 designation was to protect the natural and economic resources of the Apalachicola Bay Area.
